IMPORTANT UPDATE

METER INSTALLATIONS FOR **FLAT RATE CUSTOMERS**

As part of our upgrade efforts, we are installing meters for all flat rate customers. Here's what you need to know:

Our crews are diligently working to install meters across the community. If your property currently does not have a meter, one will need to be installed by the end of 2024.

You are encouraged to reach out to our office to set up an appointment to have your water meter installed. Having an appointment will ensure a smooth installation process by one of our technicians.

Until then, you will continue to be billed at the flat rate. Starting January 1, 2025, all water services in California must be metered as per state regulations.

MONITOR YOUR USAGE

Once a meter is installed, you will see the following details on your bill:

- 1. Meter serial number
- 2. Start and end meter reads
- 3. Total water consumption

This information will help you calculate your future bill based on your actual usage. Metered rates are available on our our website: www.oildalewater.com. If we detect unusually high usage, we will reach out to assist you in checking for leaks and managing your consumption.



IMPORTANT NOTE FOR AUTOPAY CUSTOMERS

For flat rate customers currently enrolled in auto-pay, please pay close attention to your January 2025 bill. As you transition from flat rate billing to metered billing, your bill will now reflect actual water consumption. Make sure to adjust the amount in your account accordingly to cover the total due under the new metered rates.

- Turn off water while brushing teeth.
- Install low-flow showerheads for shorter showers.
- Fix all leaky toilets, faucets and pipes.
- Run only full loads in dishwashers and washing machines.
- Don't use the toilet as a trash can.
- Turn off the water when shaving

OUTDOOR TIPS:

- Water gardens deeply once a week.
- Use a bucket when washing your car.
- Cover your swimming pool.
- Water in the evening or morning

NEW FACES, SAME COMMITMENT TO EXCELLENCE




